Who is READ Saskatoon?

READ Saskatoon creates opportunities and transforms lives of the most vulnerable members of our community through free, proven literacy programs delivered in the community in partnership with trained volunteers, like-minded organizations, and corporations.

We are a non-formal learning organization; we work alongside informal (libraries) and formal learning institutions. We do not provide credits or marks, rather we focus on assisting in the mastering of individual literacy skills such as letter and sound identification, fluency, vocabulary, spelling comprehension, finding and using information in a document, writing text using appropriate voice, adapting tone, and communicating clearly and concisely.

READ Saskatoon has more than 40 years of community literacy experience and works with 2,500+ people in the community every year. Struggling with literacy can be an extremely shame-filled, isolating experience. READ Saskatoon's free programs provide countless opportunities in the community for adults and families to learn and grow together.

Volunteers are essential to helping us accomplish our work, while having a positive impact on our community and strengthening our organization. They play an integral role in achieving our vision of a community that values, promotes, and supports literacy.

Did you know that employees who volunteer are some of the most engaged employees? Additionally, volunteering helps improve communications skills, lowers staff turnover, and decreases absenteeism.

Volunteers also have a positive impact in the communities they serve. READ Saskatoon's literacy programs are delivered by 15 staff and more than 100 trained volunteers who contribute 41,000 hours annually (the equivalent of 21 extra full-time staff!).
