Foundations Learning & Skills Saskatchewan (formerly READ Saskatoon) has a long history as a local literacy organization that offers free literacy services to adults and families.

In partnership with trained volunteers, like-minded organizations, and corporations, Foundations creates opportunities and transforms lives of the most vulnerable members of our community through free, proven literacy programs delivered in the community.

We are a non-formal learning organization; we work alongside informal (libraries) and formal learning institutions. We do not provide credits or marks, rather we focus on assisting in the mastering of individual literacy skills such as letter and sound identification, fluency, vocabulary, spelling comprehension, finding and using information in a document, writing text using appropriate voice, adapting tone, and communicating clearly and concisely.

Foundations has more than 40 years of community literacy experience and works with 3,000+ people in the community every year. Struggling with literacy can be an extremely shame-filled, isolating experience. Foundations' free programs provide countless opportunities in the community for adults and families to learn and grow together.

Our literacy programs are delivered by 17 staff and almost 200 trained volunteers. Volunteers are essential to helping us accomplish our work, while having a positive impact on our community and strengthening our organization. They play an integral role in achieving our vision that all Saskatchewan communities and individuals have equitable access to quality learning opportunities so everyone can fully participate and thrive.
